13/184 Apologies:

Apologies were presented and accepted from Mrs. F. Medley and Mr. R. Pinches.

13/185 Declaration of Personal or Prejudicial Interests:

There were no interests declared.

13/186 Minutes of Meeting held on February 11th. 2014:

The minutes of the meeting, having been circulated, were approved and signed by the Chairman as a true record.

13/187 Matters Arising:

(a) Highways (13/171(a).

It was noted that the Highways Department had indicated that all the issues raised would be dealt with but to date there were several that still needed to be resolved. Ms. McIntosh said that the potholes in Millbrook appear to have been left off the list. Clerk to check with Highways.

(b) Bird box construction workshop (13/171(c).

Clerk reported that the workshop session had been successful and that the nest boxes had been constructed and put in place. He had written to Richard Bailey thanking him for arranging the session. (c) Streetlight maintenance - upgrading contract (13/171(d).

Clerk informed Members that most of the work had been completed, although there were a few small outstanding issues to finalise. Some of the delay had been caused by Scottish Power not meeting deadline targets set by Eon. He had not received any complaints from residents about the work.

(d) Moat – New Pathways (13/171(e):

Clerk thanked all those Members who had responded promptly to his email about constructing the new paths in the Moat in the current financial year. The contract had been agreed with Mr. Allmark at a cost of £8,124 (+VAT) and he had agreed to make prompt start on the work.

(e) Litter picking contract (13/176):

Clerk confirmed that a letter had been sent to Mr. Creber offering him the contract, subject to the receipt of a copy of his third party insurance cover and a risk assessment document. To date this had not been received. Mr. Kennedy offered to speak to him and get copies of the documents for forwarding to the Clerk

(f) Loose Dogs (13/175(iii):

The problems associated with loose dogs on the playing field had been sent to Shropshire Council and they had arranged for the dog warden to visit the offending owner and issue a formal warning. If there were any further problems with the dogs, they would be taken into kennels and the owner would be fined and charged kennelling fees.

(g) Community Service Awards:

Clerk reported that Group Captain Smith from RAF Shawbury had confirmed that they would continue to sponsor the awards. Details of the awards had been published and to date he had received one nomination.

(h) CCTV Camera (13/156):

Water getting into the system had caused a breakdown and the need for a replacement unit which had cost £450.00 (inclusive of VAT). Labour costs were covered by the maintenance agreement. A bid for grant money to cover the costs involved in hosting and maintaining the camera and recording equipment had been submitted to the West Mercia Police Authority.

13/190 Financial Statement:

A financial statement was tabled and approved.

13/191 Exchange of Information:

(a)Items for inclusion on the next agenda:

- 1. Maintenance and oversight of the Moat area.
- 2. Painting of Village seats.
- (b) The following concerns were reported:

(i) Highways:

- 1. Mr. Foster reported that an area of the A53 outside the Garden Centre was breaking up.
- 2. It was noted that there was a waste bin by the new bus stop on the A53 heading towards Shrewsbury but that the old one had not been removed and was causing an obstruction.

Clerk to inform the Highways Department of both issues.

Mr. Sharp raised continued concerns about the changes to Church Street and wondered if signs were to be erected, as some motorists were driving through the narrow area much too quickly. Mr. Jones pointed out that the system had been designed by Shropshire Council to be self-regulated and there were no 'rights of way'. As a result they had decided not to erect 'give way'signs.

(ii) Streetlights:

No issues raised.

(iii) Other:

- 1. Members approved applications for the use of the playing field from:
- (a) Shropshire Cat Rescue wanting to hold car boot sales on Saturday May 3rd. and Saturday August 30th.
- (b) Grinshill Dog Rescue for dog show/car boot sale on Sunday August 14^{th.}

- (c) Shawbury School to hold a charity walk round the Glebe footpaths on March 21st.
- 2. The Clerk had received a report from Mr. Tony Cook that the daffodils planted on the grass verge in Church Street had been strimmed. The Clerk was attempting to find out who was responsible.

13/192 Community Infrastructure:

Chairman gave a report on the conference attended by him and the Clerk. It appeared that many of the rules had changed and the system was complex with regard to completing place plans and the allocation of Cil money. There was some money in the fund for Shawbury but it seemed that we would receive very little of it.

13/193 Grass Cutting Contracts.

Members considered quotations from three contractors and awarded the contract to Nobridge Ltd. who had provided the cheapest quotes for all areas of the work required. The total cost would be £161.71 per cut.

(c) Shropshire Council:

Councillor Simon Jones confirmed that the planning department had been informed that caravans had moved onto the Sparrow Cottage site and that he had reported damage to two fir trees alongside the A53, close to the entrance to the Moat. He had received details of revised planning regulations which he would forward to the Clerk for distribution to Members.

Moat Committee:

The Chairman reported that at the last committee meeting it had been decided to dissolve the Committee and Members were issued with a paper outlining this, as well as a copy of the minutes of the meeting and items reported by the Committee Chairman, Mr. Adrian Brown.

After discussion it was decided that:

- 1. The Council Chairman would store all the tools/equipment which are currently held by Adrian Brown.
- 2. The Clerk would write to all the members of the Moat Committee thanking them for the valuable work they had carried out over a number of years, transforming the area from a wilderness to its present state.
- 3. At the next Council meeting there would be a need to decide the future management of the area. Clerk to invite Mr. Bailey to the meeting.

The Chairman reported that he had been in contact with Scott Turner at the RAF Station, who had promised to provide a working party from the station on March 29th. to carry out on - site maintenance work. In the meantime he would keep a watching brief over the site.

- (c) Consider re-planting the Jubilee tree in the Glebe area. Clerk to discuss this with Richard Bailey
